Attendance update

Thank you to all parent/carers for supporting their child's attendance. We have relaunched our attendance tracker to support our continued improved attendance, which this term stands at <u>95.5%</u> and the national average is 96%.

We would like to remind you that you are required to report the absence of the child in your care by 9am every morning, if they are reported as absent due to sickness we require a call every day. Absences can be reported by contacting the school office absence line or via email. Please provide a full reason for absence including the symptoms.

Please remember that in accordance with The Department for Education (DfE) guidelines, holidays taken in term time will not be authorised. Families who take holidays in term time risk being issued with a Fixed Penalty notice, being referred to the EWO, or in some cases the child may lose their school place.

Parents are encouraged to make medical and dental appointments outside of school hours. When this is not possible, please ensure you bring proof of the appointment so that we can enter the correct code onto our system. For example, this could be a text message confirming an appointment or a letter with appointment date and time on.

Pupil Premium and Free School Meals for Summerhill children

What is it and why apply for it?

To help Summerhill get extra funding! Pupil Premium funding goes directly to the school and pays for things like school trips, breakfast clubs, or additional teachers and assistants to provide extra support and 1 to 1 tutoring - how amazing is that?!



Bristol City Council are asking all parents whose children go to school in Bristol to find out if their child can get free schools meals and to register for Pupil Premium fund-

ing.

Pupil Premium funding is around £1320 per primary school child and around £935 per secondary school child.

This money makes a big difference to schools and the eligible pupils. We report on how we spend the money on our website.

Who is eligible to apply for this funding?

The Pupil Premium is extra funding for **every child who's eligible for free school meals** throughout their time at school.

Parents/Carers of children in Year 3 and older (including secondary schools) can apply for free school meals and Pupil Premium from Year 3 onwards if you get any of these benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit: if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get. This is also called the 'minimum income floor'.) If your child is eligible for free school meals they will eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they are in on 31 March 2023.

How do I apply?

Applying online is the easiest way. You'll get an immediate decision or we'll tell you if we need more information.

There's still time to take part in the Big Walk/Big Run - up until Mon 31 May 2021!

Our CLF Big Walk and Run started as a running event that staff took part in annually at the Bristol 10k. In recent years the event has spiralled and is now a firm highlight of our Big Calendar. This year, we



are attempting to run 11,622 miles (a mile for every child in our trust) and raise the equivalent in funding (£11,662) for our most disadvantaged children.

We are running throughout the month of May and our staff and children are committing to walking or running a number of miles towards the cause. The event promotes mental health and wellbeing through activity to support our children to engage with education on a deeper level following the fairly challenging year we have all had. Our curriculum offer supports children to prepare for healthy lifestyles in a variety of ways; being physically active, learning the skills and knowledge associated with being an athlete, taking care of our wellbeing and understanding supportive strategies to maintain good mental health; this event speaks to all of these priorities.

Each staff participant receives a t shirt which we wear and share proudly in selfies via social media throughout the event, look out for the hashtags #CLFBigRun or #CLFBigWalk on social sites throughout to see how we are getting on.

In addition to our staff and children pledging miles, we have also been joined by some celebrity friends of the trust who are supporting us in raising the profile of this event and boosting our fundraising totals. This year we are joined by Charlie Cox, Romy Gill, Ben Smith, Roger Black, The Bristol Flyers Basketball Team and Mr Motivator, who will be sharing their Big Run pledges and stories of support via social media. Mr Motivator is also running a special training session to get us all in the mood for some activity!

Summer Hill Academy has a temporary vacancy for a School Crossing Patrol. Would you be interested in getting involved and taking on this role. This is a term time only role that helps your school community. It is a paid position and you are paid for ten hours per week term time. The hourly rate is £9.30 and the hours are annualised as they are for other school roles. Full training and uniform will be provided.
