As part of our ongoing commitment to improving our environment through encouraging insect and plant life and developing our school grounds, a new hedge is being planted along our border with Plummers Hill. With the support of the Woodland Trust, each child will be planting their own sapling. These include hawthorn, dogwood, rowan and silver birch, which are native species designed to be good for local wildlife. We are really looking forward to seeing our saplings grow into a hedge that will provide a home for a range of insects as well as being a natural barrier from the road.

Thanks to Duncan for his support with the hedgerow planting, and please

be sure to look after them and stay clear of the planting area!
